## MINOR REQUIREMENTS

The Department of Modern & Classical Languages Literatures & Cultures offers a minor in Classics for both the Bachelor of Arts & a Bachelor of Science degree. The division teaches a broad range of courses in the languages, literature, history, art, & thought of the Greco-Roman world, & the minor is made flexible so as to accompany a wide variety of majors in the university.

### MINOR REQUIREMENTS:

The requirements for a Classics minor are 18 credit hours, at least 6 of which must be at the 300 level or above, earned from among the following courses:

1. Greek and Latin courses at any level
2. Non-language CLA courses at the 200 level or higher

All courses may be chosen from category 1, all from category 2, or the two categories may be combined in any manner, as long as students earn the requisite 18 credit hours. MCL 100, MCL 200, MCL 375 and MCL 376 may count toward the MCL/Classics minor.
