This program offers students the opportunity to explore sites in Rome, Southern Italy, and Sicily in an attempt to reconstruct the cultural and material interactions between the ancient Greeks and the inhabitants of Italy, including the Romans. Students will study the historical background of the two great phases of Greek cultural expansion in the Mediterranean as well as ancient texts in translation by or about ancient Greeks in Italy. A special focus of the course will be the Villa dei Papiri, the Greek and Roman Library which was buried by the eruption of Mt. Vesuvius in 78 CE, and the attempt to decipher the scrolls which survived the destruction. Students will visit the major museums as well as some of the locations and settings of the ancient texts. Through this immersive study of the literary and material culture of Rome, Southern Italy, and Sicily students will come away with a deeper understanding and appreciation of the roots of the West in ancient Italy.



Award amounts range between \$750 and \$1,500. This application and information on other education abroad scholarships may be found at international.uky.edu/ea. Deadlines are February 1 for Summer, April 1 for Fall and October 1 for Spring and Winter programs.

UK Women's Club Travel Abroad Scholarship:

UK Education Abroad partners with the UK Woman's Club (UKWC) to provide awards for high-ability students on for-credit Education Abroad programs, who are Kentucky residents and demonstrate financial need. This scholarship is available for full-time UK students, both undergraduate and graduate, with a minimum GPA of 3.2. Maximum Summer award is \$500 and maximum Fall award is \$1,000. Deadline is March 1st for Summer and Fall programs.




CERTIFICATE OF GLOBAL STUDIES
