These courses include CHI 101, CHI 102, CHI 201, CHI 202, CHI 301, CHI 302, CHI 401 and CHI 402 in regular semesters and CHI 101, CHI 102 in some Summer Sessions. In Spring 2018, I co-taught MCL 591-005: Language Practicum-Advanced Conversational Chinese, with Dr. Mathew Wells. In Summer 2019 and Summer 2020, I taught Online Beginning Chinese I (CHI 101-210) that I designed a year earlier.
- Organize and advise UK Chinese Club activities and events. Guide Chinese Club student officers in working with peer students and campus community and promoting each event.
 - o During the process of setting up UK Chinese Club in Fall 2018 semester, I worked with volunteered student officers to submit the Constitution of the Chinese Club to the University Student Organization and participated in the UK CSA training each time as required.  - o Some major events include: Pumpkin decoration (Fall 2018), Field trip to local orchard (Fall 2018), Built partnership with Project Pengyou UK Chapter (Spring 2019), Monthly get-together for Chinese conversation practice (Spring 2019), Help MCLLC Chinese Studies Program to promote the Chinese New Year Week (January 21-24, Spring 2020), Biweekly Conversational Hour at Gatton Student Center Starbucks (Spring 2020) and Monthly Movie Night (Spring 2020). During the pandemic in Fall 2020 semester, all the events were held via Zoom regularly.
 - o Weekly activity in Fall 2021 semester, including Chinese Language Table, Cultural event (Mid-Autumn Festival), Movie Night, and Sports Night. (Fall 2021)

Preparation work started in the fall semester included working with UK Education Abroad Office, UK Confucius Institute, organizing information sessions for students, writing recommendation letters, inviting colleagues in Chinese Studies Program and UK Education Abroad student ambassador to promote the program. During the summer program, I lived with students on the university campus in China and gave them guidance on a daily basis. (2013, 2016, 2018)

 - In Spring 2017, I started the process of proposing Beginning Chinese online courses. Later during the preparation stage, I discussed with Beth Gaunce, Online Campus Manager at KET about online teaching method. I worked with Sarah Asher, instructional designer in UK Informational Technology Services and Alex Cutadean, UK IS Technical Support Specialist in Distance Learning to develop

the online teaching materials. I scheduled regularly with UK Faculty Media Depot to make videos and audios for the online courses. In Summer 2019, I taught one of the courses online.

- In Spring 2018, I went to Prof. Liang Luo's CHI 331 to advertise CHI 101 with my students.
 - In Fall 2018 semester, I collaborated with UK Confucius Institute and designed T-shirt for our Chinese Studies Program. The T-shirts and program flyers were handed out to students at one of the CI events on campus.
 - In Fall 2019, I proposed Business Chinese course for CHI 202 and discussed it at the program meeting. I also shared the syllabus and teaching outline with my colleagues.
 - At the end of Fall 2019 semester, after our Chinese Studies Working Group Meeting, I worked with Dr. Jeanmarie Rouhier-Willoughby, our department chair to compose a letter introducing all the language programs in our department to Prof. Nancy Johnson, the Associate Dean at Gatton College, hoping to attract their students to study language for their business profession.

I prepared students for HSK tests so that they are eligible for receiving UKCI financial support. I wrote recommendation letters for students to receive scholarships and helped each student with program application forms and Visa applications. After arriving in Shanghai University, I lived together with students on campus in the international student dormitory during the whole program. I gave students guidance and help to their life and study on a daily basis.
 - o Organize weekly/bi-weekly Chinese language pedagogy meeting. Share teaching materials and teaching strategies.
 - o Work with UK Confucius Institute to secure funding for student Chinese Speaking and Writing Contest in 2017 fall semester.
 - o Coordinate and supervise the Chinese Tutoring Program. In Fall 2019, when Yen Yu Lin, TA for CHI 101-001 and CHI 101-002 came to teach each Thursday, I sat in each class and gave suggestions before and after class regarding classroom activities and ways of teaching grammar.
